Welcome to Holy Trinity, where services have been held, in this church, since 1863. We pray that you will feel the presence of God and know his blessings in your life.

You are invited to Morning Tea after today's service in the Parish Centre.

Dear Parishioners,

We welcome today Mina and Jonathan who bring Margaux Grace for baptism with their family and friends at the 10am service. May they be abundantly blessed by God in their family life together.

In our Gospel reading this morning, Jesus promises his disciples that the gift of his peace will accompany the sending of the Spirit. This peace stands in stark contrast to the obedience of the subjects terrorised into submission by Rome's imperial might — and, in particular, by the gruesome fate of the rebels whom it crucified.

In the Old Testament, flame is used as an image of purgation (cf. Malachi 3.2). As Cyril of Alexandria (375 - 444 A.D.) explains, the fire of Pentecost "consumes the thorns of sins but gives lustre to the soul". He tells those who are preparing for baptism that the fire of the Spirit "is now coming upon you also in order to strip away and consume your sins, which are like thorns, and to brighten yet more that precious possession of your souls, and to give you grace, the same given then to the apostles". These words capture two aspects of the Spirit's refining work. It is painful, because it "strips away and consumes" our sin. But it is, above all, an act of divine love, restoring in us the "lustre" of God's image.

These twin themes - love and purgation - are reflected in our Gospel. Jesus describes the Holy Spirit both as the "Advocate" and as the "Spirit of truth", which "the world cannot receive because it neither sees nor knows him". Such "truth" is more than a purely cognitive understanding. The Lord desires not simply right belief (Psalm 51.6, James 2.18f) but truth in the inward being. His Spirit comes not to inform, but to transform, us.

Precisely because the Spirit is our "Advocate" (or "Comforter"), we have no need to fear this transforming work. St Catherine of Siena (1347-1380 A.D.) explains that, as we cease to live in fear of God's judgement, our sins become instead the cause of tears of penitence. As the Spirit draws us into a deeper state of union with God, we are filled with sorrow at the ways in which our sins estrange us from him and damage those around us. We no

longer fear God's refining fire, but embrace this work of individual and corporate transformation.

The miracle of Pentecost divides the crowd: as Jesus indicates in our Gospel reading, some choose not to "see or know" the work of the Spirit. These sceptics sneer that the disciples "are filled with new wine" - a barb that contains a deeper truth than they can recognise. For, as Cyril of Alexandria explains, they are indeed filled with the new wine of the Spirit. This "sober drunkenness" is "deadly to sin and life-giving to the heart". Whereas ordinary drunkenness causes "forgetfulness of what was known", the intoxication of the Spirit leads us to "knowledge even of what was not known": a living union with God, which brings his love and truth to the very depths of our being.







THE BAPTISM

When Jesus had risen from the dead, he commanded his followers to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We have come together today in obedience to that command. In baptism, we are joined to Christ, and made members of his Church.

Baptism of children is a celebration of new life and the promise of eternal life, and an acknowledgement of their need for care and protection.

While we focus on the grace of God given to those who are baptized, we also acknowledge that spiritual growth depends on parents and godparents, and the wider circle of family and friends, who are the examples and influence that mould a child's character. In this service of baptism we bring Margaux into God's presence that she may be enfolded in the grace of the Holy Spirit.

Parents and Godparents who bring children for baptism must express their own trust and commitment to the promises of God, and their intention to bring up the children in the faith and practice of the Church.

The Baptism party gathers around the font. The parents and godparents are asked the questions:

Q/ Before God and this congregation, you must affirm your belief in God and so I ask: Do you Believe in God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

A/I do.

Q/ Will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Margaux for baptism?

A/ I will.

Q/ By your prayers and example, by your friendship and love, will you encourage her in the life and faith of the Christian community?

A/ I will.

Q/ As your life will be an example to Margaux, will you turn away from evil thoughts, words and actions?

A/I will.

Q/ Will you affirm Christian values, especially those of honesty, compassion and mercy?

A/I will.

Priest to the congregation: You have heard our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

ALL: WE WILL.

Priest: Almighty God lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom.

AMEN.

Prayers and Blessing of the water

[Let us pray:] Grant, merciful God, that Margaux may be so united with Christ in baptism that your new nature may be raised up in her where the fruit of your Spirit may grow and flourish. Give to family and friends the desire to share what you have revealed in your Holy Gospel.

We give you thanks that at the beginning of creation your Holy Spirit moved upon the waters to bring forth light and life. With water you cleanse and replenish the earth; and through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people by Moses out of slavery into freedom, and brought them through the river Jordan into the land of promise. We give you thanks for your Son, Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing in the Holy Spirit, and that through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph. We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who leads us to your kingdom.

And now we give you thanks that you have called Margaux to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism.

+ Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that all who are baptized may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, through Jesus Christ our Lord, AMEN.

An affirmation of faith

Priest: I ask the congregation to join with the parents and godparents in affirming the faith of the church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

A/: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

A/: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

A/: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. AMEN.

The Baptism

Priest: Margaux Grace, I baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, **AMEN**.

I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own forever.

(Oil that has been blessed by a bishop is used in anointing to symbolize being chosen in God, as were the priests and prophets of the Old Testament, and the New Testament understanding that we are all anointed in the Spirit through belief in Christ.)

Live as a disciple of Christ; fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.

ALL: Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

Priest: God has called you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

ALL: Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

Priest: God has called you into his church.

ALL: We therefore receive and welcome you as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.

Prayers for the child, parents and godparents

Merciful God, in your infinite love you have made a new covenant with us in Jesus Christ, promising to be our God and the God of our children. Enable all who are baptized in your name to live as your faithful people.

Fulfil your promises for Margaux, we pray, and grant that she may grow in your faith and service.


We pray for Mina and Jonathan, that in your Spirit of wisdom, Margaux's family may grow in your love, and their home share in the joy of your eternal kingdom.







- b) from an individual glass upon request.


 Or you may choose to receive the bread only as Holy Communion in one kind.
